I can remember the fishermen pulling the conny fish in off the jetty to be weighed, they were bigger than me, about 20 feet in length and weighed quite a lot, they were so heavy a crane had to pick them up to be weighed. The harbour used to be full of boats, from Hall to Hall on some occasions and with no room for anymore boats to land, the herring season was like this, the seasons were long in them days with plenty to catch for all. The selling market used to be packed out with auctioneers walking across the boxes as there was no ground to be seen. It really was a fantastic time to be around on the pier in them days. The hustle and bustle of the lads working was a sight to be seen.
